Once they are installed, *Seal the Loop* bins make it easy for recreational anglers to dispose of their waste, and serve as a reminder of the importance of looking after the environment. Thank you for your commitment to tackling this problem and protecting our precious marine wildlife!

What happens now?

After you have submitted this form, Zoos Victoria staff will be in touch to confirm installation location/s and provide any support you may need (E.g.: working with the land manager if required). We will then supply you with your bin/s ready to install (pick-up currently available from Melbourne Zoo, Healesville Sanctuary or Werribee Open Range Zoo).

Once installed, the management and emptying of the bins becomes the responsibility of you and your organisation. In the event that you/your organisation are no longer able to monitor the bins, please contact us at takeaction@zoo.org.au.

How do we monitor the success of the bins?

An important part of the Seal the Loop program is monitoring the use of the bins and the success of the program in your area.

Every year, *Seal the Loop* organises a short data collection period between August and October. This involves each bin custodian reporting on the type and amount of waste collected in the bins during this period. We would really appreciate your involvement in data collection, as it helps to gain an important insight into how much fishing line is prevented from entering waterways and oceans. We use this information to continuously improve, and to demonstrate how important the bins, and you as a bin custodian, are to protecting marine wildlife.
